The lecture, presentation and discussion covered the following topics: "cycling infrastructure", "safety", "future possibilities of bike infrastructure" and "engagement of education and citizens". They talked and discussed about bicycle paths, the importance of using a bicycle, then the problems we face when using a bicycle as a means of transportation and much more. The research focus was on the issue of public participation in cycling policies in Sarajevo.

During the presentation itself, the students had the opportunity to access the research where the questions were specifically related to the city of Sarajevo and the bicycle infrastructure, and the research related to drawing on the map of the city of Sarajevo places where there is an adequate





bicycle path, and then also places where there is none at all or it was inadequately built, and the students and researchers themselves were able to locate localities in the area of the city of Sarajevo that should be freed from motor traffic, that is, should be promenades and park areas with bike paths. The atmosphere at the lectures was always useful, cheerful, smiling for us Bosnians and Irish, and there were also French people studying in Ireland. We agreed to meet again, if not "live" then online.
